



Hierarchical GC editor providing overview and streamlined navigation






Consistent (delegated) configuration picker










Consistency for setting configuration context across applications







Remaining Items for v6.0 Release




- Diff / merg in DNG and RQM (low hanging fruit)
 - Compare configuration with command in the config context menu
 - Accept changes command in the config context menu, and launch their respective merge UI
 - Source pane on the left; Target pane on the right
- Common UI for enabling CM capability (aka. opt-in)



Candidates and Priority for Future



- Data migration
- 2. See the contents of change set(s) even after it's delivered in a configuration
- 3. Hierarchical GC editor providing overview and streamlined navigation
- Branch automation (auto branch parents of the selected stream)
- 5. Consistent (delegated) configuration picker
- 6. Component skew should not be allowed (allow in a controlled way)
- 7. Always tell me what configuration I am in
- Change request process and change set
- 9. Ability to baseline the whole GC at once (i.e. recursively create baselines in all the contributors)
- 10. Configuration naming convention
- 11. Consistency across configuration management icons, menus and actions
- 12. Lack of visual indication when in a baseline
- 13. Request option to auto create new tool baseline / stream when creating new GC baseline / stream
- 14. UI scalability for configuration management
- 15. Request RQM to support change set similar to DNG
- 16. Under the Change Set menu there is no option to sort/filter the results
- 17. Require more ways to search for Global streams & baselines
- 18. Strange to use checkbox to turn on CM capability
